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



Note:

Lissitzky's uniform design for sheet music of the Société de la musique hébraïque was used for a series of musical compositions, including those by Alexandre Creïn (1883-1951) and by the Jewish music revivalist Joel Engel (1868-1927). Known examples of Engel's compositions in the series include: "Mélodie de mon père" (no. [24]), "Air de dance" (no. 32), "Joc, dance" (no. 33), "Oh! Si mes voeux étaient accomplish!" (no. 48), and "Vois la-bas" (no. 50).




East German facsimile of the poster: Klinom krasnym bei belykh (Beat the Whites with the Red Wedge), 1960s (after 1920 original)


































Covers of Veshch / Objet / Gegenstand (Berlin: Verlag Skythen), no. 1-2 (March-April 1922)

This landmark exhibition was on view at the Galerie von Diemen in Berlin from October 15 to the end of December 1922. Although the organizers hoped that it would travel to other European capitals and even to New York, the exhibition only traveled to the Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam (28 April – 28 May, 1923). This copy of the catalogue includes a four-page insert in Dutch for the Stedelijk show with a "Hollandisch Voorwoord" by W. Steenhoff; a list of works shown in Amsterdam, though not in the catalogue (nos. 595-623); and a list of works in the catalogue, though not shown in Amsterdam





















Note:

Lissitzky's famous photomontaged self-portrait reproduced on the cover of *Foto-Auge* was created in June 1924 while working on *The Isms of Art* (pp. 54-55 during the same period that he created a photomontaged portrait of Jean (Hans) Arp (pp. 66-67). The earliest known reproduction of the self-portrait was in Paul Westheim, "Zeitlupe," *Das Kunstblatt* 12 (March 1928), p. 89 as "Der Konstrukteur" (The Constructor).











An arrow in graphite on the verso of this work by an unidentified hand indicates that the orientation should be vertical, as pictured here. The closely-related lithograph (fig. 2), however, is accompanied by a monogram orienting the composition horizontally.


